CAMPAIGN AGAINST FEMALE FETICIDE & PROTECTION OF GIRLCHILD

Indian society is male dominated in every walk of life. Fondness for male child in our society is never ending. As a girl is considered Paraya Dhan therefore, in our patriarchal society sons are valued more than daughters. Determination of sex before birth and abortion has very become easier with advanced technologies and medicines. This is made illegal offence by the government of India through enacting Pre- Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PNDT) Act of 1994. This law again amended and became pre conception and pre -natal diagnostic techniques (Regulation & Prevention of Misuses) (PCPNDT) Act 2004. Still this practice persists across the country. Deep Welfare Organization is persistently working to make society more and more educate about meaning of gender equality and eradicate gender-based discrimination from society. Deep Welfare Organization is working to change the notion of having a girl is a burden through our regular campaigns at national, state and district levels wherein we organize dialogue, debate and give a platform to people who wish to express their views and ideas. As Deep Welfare Organization is concerned about the children being subject to sexual violence, sexual harassment & pornography through various online platforms and other social media, we work to draw the attention of government for strict implementation of laws through rallies, street plays and community involvement in the states of Jharkhand, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh and in National Capital Region of Delhi. We keep raising these issues at national and state level through regular national seminars and deliberations. We organized community meetings wherein we sensitization how everyone can play an important role in eradicating such issues by their contribution. Gender sensitization is a very important topic for the holistic development of our society but sadly it doesn't get much attention in our country which is more of a social problem. This practice happens both in rural areas as well as in urban areas. The UN Population Fund predicted in 2007 that the sex imbalance in India would lead to a shortage of 25 million women by 2030. Therefore, to bridge the gender gap we need to talk about this issue. We are working to aware about the welfare schemes introduced by the government for girls so that our daughters are not taken as a liability.



WOMEN EMPOWERMENT & DEVELOPMENT

Since the beginning of our journey firm commitment toward gender equality & Empowerment of Women has been a focus area of work. Empowerment of women consists of better health facilities, equal education and economic opportunities for all. It is a process of creating an enabling environment for their upliftment. It is just about economic, social and political as well where they have equal say in decision making and in every walk of life.

There are many social taboos which are hinders in the path of women empowerment, such as silence about menstruation, pressure like women should get married early and bear a child. These are the unwanted barriers in the path of development. Deep Welfare Organization works to break the old age taboos about menstruation and menstrual hygiene and spreading awareness about the importance of talking more often on this crucial topic in our society. We organize regular sessions in collaboration with experts from Ministry and Department of WCD, consultant and Academicians via online/ offline mode wherein we teach how menstrual hygiene is important, what important nutrition women should add in their diet and importance of taking care of their health. We organize workshops and capacity building programs for women such as self-defense training, creating awareness on gender based violence, running campaigns against sexual & mental abuse, domestic violence and legal rights. We are working in 5 States i.e. Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh and Union Territory of Delhi. Our target demographics are the tribes, urban slums and rural community, women & girls from the respective community. We take youth volunteers who are enthusiastic for change, creating awareness and consciousness on situation of our other half, gender discrimination and importance of equal opportunities for all, join us in our mission.

Deep have conducted community meetings in local areas with wherein we organized a session on verbal & sexual violence, dowry system, child marriage, domestic violence and how they can raise their voice against any kinds of violence. We assist and guide affected women in filing complains, medicines & providing mental health counseling. We all of them with helpline numbers such as 108, 112 and mahila police volunteers and our volunteers also shared their contact numbers to reach out whenever they are in distress. Spreading awareness about BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO, ONE STOP CENTRES, WOMEN HELPLINE etc. With the help of CSR and other partner organization Deep Welfare Organization Organise Bitiya Gaurav Award where we celebrate achievements and contribution of our daughters and women from all walks of life in the growth of nation, in the presence of dignitaries and distinguished speakers share their views on gender and related issues and how India as a nation has work more to make a more inclusive society.



VOCATIONAL TRAINING & SKILL

Our women are born with many skills, but to become economically independent, it is important to know modern skills that are demanded in the market. Making our youths and women economically empowered, Deep Welfare Organization runs vocational training and skill development programs.

The Deep Welfare Organization is working to provide them with such skills that help them earn their livelihood.

As India is walking on the path of the VIKSIT BHARAT SANKALP vocational training program, it becomes important to achieve this. Such programs give an identity to our sisters and mothers. Deep Welfare Organization is providing vocational training to young girls and women, illiterate & unskilled sections, through its vocational training centers. We provide training and diploma certificates of beauty parlor, computer training and stitching in Bhagalpur district of Bihar and the National Capital Territory of Delhi, where our centers are running regularly. Almost all girls and women are from economically weaker sections and want to help their husbands and families economically. We are working with a special focus to enhance occupational skills and technical knowledge and to promote national values and align with national programs and schemes run by the state and central governments. Deep Welfare Organization is consistently working to promote self-employment & provide support through linkages with SHGs and other credits. After successfully completing the period of training from the skill center, these women and girls are feeling empowered, and those who have completed their training program have started running boutique centers and beauty parlors and working as trainers at various places. We provide skill training for six months and one year, and after completing the course, we conduct their assessment (practical & theory) and then provide certificates to all trainees.

Deep is relentlessly working towards. Empowering community women and girls through inculcating the skills. Deep provides a certificate of Jan Shikshan Sansthan (Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, Govt. of India).

Deep Welfare Organization is continuously reaching out to the community and identifying new needs. Deep is working as a catalyst and aligning with other institutions and welfare agencies to promote such other kinds of training programs for income generation.



CHILD EDUCATIONAL & DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

According to international standards, even if a person under the age of 18 is married and has children of her/his own, she/he is recognised as a child. Children need special care, attention and support for proper growth because they are more vulnerable than adults to the condition under which they live. Children are especially vulnerable to exploitation and abuse. Therefore, the Deep Welfare Organization has always focused on early childhood care and education (ECE). We are working to promote child rights, protection of children from sexual offences, on children in conflict with laws, and on judgment of Supreme Court children in street situations. Our focus is on the certain rights given by the Constitution of India, such as the "right to free and compulsory elementary education for all children from age 6 to 14 (Article 21A).

- Right to be protected from any hazardous employment till the age of 14 years (Article 24).
- Right to be protected from being abused and forced by economic necessity to enter occupations unsuited to their age or strength (Article 39(e)).
- Right to equal opportunities and facilities to develop in a healthy manner and in conditions of freedom and dignity and guaranteed protection of childhood and youth against exploitation and against moral and material abandonment (Article 39(f)).

But despite these provisions, no state in India has achieved 100% child enrolment in schools. Large numbers of children's are away from school. We are running educational programs for the children of marginalized communities in the national capital territory of Delhi, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh & Bihar. We have been running non-formal educational (NFE) centers for the last 15 years. We prepare children to get enrolled in nearby schools, with the counseling of their parents. Most of the children belong to urban and rural slum areas, whose parents are street vendors, daily wagers and migrants. We work on re-admission of dropout children in schools. DEEP through its non-formal education is making sure that not a single child is devoid of his/her education. Deep is working with a special focus on ensuring to create a safe environment for children and providing supplementary education from the age group of 6 to 15 years. Under the early childhood care and protection program, we connect every child with Anganwadi centres, focusing on providing nutritional food and care. We worked with the Department of Women & Child Development, Govt. of NCT of Delhi, on the judgment of the honorable supreme court of India on SAMPARC (Sustainable Approach for Multifaceted Progress Aimed at Reclaiming Childhood). Deep worked to identify street-living children who ran away from their families and live alone on the streets, children who spend most of their time on the streets but return home on a regular basis, and children from street families who live on the streets with their families. We rescued such children and worked with child care institutions and rehabilitation centers.



HEALTH AWARENESS PROGRAM

A healthy body is important for a healthy mind because "health is wealth." Only a healthy citizen can contribute to the growth of its nation. In our journey to create an educated and empowering society for women and children, our focus is also towards creating a healthier society.

"Right to Health" is a fundamental right guaranteed under Article 21 of the Constitution of India". It includes affordable treatment, and it is the duty of the state to make provisions for affordable treatment. The right to health is inherent to a life with dignity. Access to affordable and quality health facilities is the right of every citizen. According to a report, India has a high burden of communicable and non-communicable diseases, including tuberculosis, HIV/AIDS, malaria and diabetes.

There is a gender disparity in terms of availing health facilities in India, such as for women, there is limited access to health care, a high maternal mortality rate, & gender-based violence. According to the World Economic Forum 2021, India consistently ranks among the five worst countries in the world for the health & survival of women. We are focusing on the importance of health & hygiene, hand washing, menstrual hygiene, breastfeeding and anemia among women so as to create awareness among communities and increase health literacy. The government has launched several schemes for reproductive, maternal, neonatal, Child and adolescent health. These are: Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakaram (JSSK), Rashtriya Kishor Swasthya Karyakram (RKSK), Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK), Universal Immunization Programme, Mission Indradhanush (MI), Janani Suraksha Yojana (JSY), Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan (PMSMA), and Navjaat Shishu Suraksha Karyakram (NSSK).

We are running an awareness drive for women about these schemes. Deep is working on community-wide, audience-specific, focusing on increasing audience knowledge. As awareness is essential for prevention, precautions and early detection, we conduct programs in communities, schools, street plays, health awareness camps and informative talks for targeted communities. To address these issues, the government has introduced many healthcare schemes over the years, such as Ayushman Bharat Yojna/Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojna (PMJAY), Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojna (PMBJP) and Rashtriya Arogya Nidhi (RAN). In view of this social issue, the Deep Welfare Organization is continuously working on the proper implementation of these schemes and nudging with doctors, social activists and volunteers to reach the last mile.



HIV/AIDS AWARENESS PROGRAMME

Deep Welfare Organisation is working for 15 years for eradication of Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV).

HIV is a virus which attacks body's immune system. If it is not treated on right time, it can lead to the AIDS (acquired immunodeficiency syndrome). There is no permanent or effective cure against this disease, therefore, this needs a proper medical care because once people get HIV they have it for life. According to the report of WHO "HIV remains a global public health issue, having claimed 40.4 million lives so far with ongoing transmission in all countries globally".

We are working to raise awareness about HIV testing, Prevention, treatment & to remove stigma against HIV/AIDS. HIV/AIDS can affect anyone regardless of caste, class, gender, race or age. It can be treated with access to effective HIV prevention, diagnosis, treatment and care.

It is important to spread awareness against misinformation, racism, homophobia and transphobia. It is a responsibility of everyone to normalize talking about HIV& getting tested timely. Government of India has launched the first National AIDS Control Program. To spread the awareness worldwide 1 December is celebrated as world aids day by UNAIDS, which talks about HIV treatment, testing, prevention and increase availability of services, eradication of stigma and exclusion faced by people living with HIV and by marginalized population, so that an encouraging and supporting environment could be created.

National AIDS Control Program (NACP) was launched to slow down the spread of HIV infections so as to reduce morbidity, mortality and impact of AIDS in the country. make promise and take precautions to stop spreading HIV because awareness is the key of prevention. Therefore, Deep is relentlessly engaged in generating awareness in our targeted geographies: East Singhbhum, bokaro in the state of Jharkhand, Rohats and Bhagalpur districts of Bihar, Burari, in NCT of Delhi, Lukhnow in Uttar Pradesh and Singhrauli in Madhya Pradesh. Our organization is playing a pivotal role in mass campaigning through Information, Education and Communication cells among communities and in other high risk groups. According to a report of The Hindu news paper 38million people are living with AIDS all over the world, of whom 23 lakh live in India. 91% of the affected people contracted the virus by engaging in unsafe sex. It shows challenges still persist. Ours is a joint effort with government departments, community and members of civil society in this regard.

We are making it sure that the person affected by HIV/AIDS are not deprived of any kind of treatment facility. In this regard mass campaigning is very important to perish the stigma, fear and ignorance among people. Our team is working dedicatedly to remove stigma related to HIV/AIDS.



JAL JEEVAN MISSION

The initiatives undertaken by the Deep Welfare Organisation in collaboration with the Ministry of Jal Shakti under the Jal Jeevan Mission are commendable and critical for enhancing water security and quality in rural areas of Chhattisgarh. Here are some key highlights of your work:

1. Objective of Jal Jeevan Mission: The mission aims to provide Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTC) to all rural households by 2024, ensuring access to safe and potable drinking water.
2. Geographical Focus: Your organization is actively working in Kanker and Mungeli districts, targeting 92 villages and 107 Gram Panchayats, specifically in the blocks of Durgkondel, Naharpur, and Patheria.
3. Water Quality Awareness: By celebrating "Jal Gunvatta Parikshan Divas", we promote the importance of maintaining high water quality standards.
4. Infrastructure Development: Building water supply infrastructure is essential to ensure that every household has access to adequate and safe water.
5. Grassroots Training and Awareness: Training community members (water sisters) and creating awareness around water conservation, grey water management, and rainwater harvesting.
6. Community Engagement: Formation of water committees at the grassroots level to facilitate community participation and regular training in water quality testing.
7. Household Surveys: Conducting surveys on water safety and security to better understand the local challenges and address them effectively.
8. Public Awareness Campaigns: Running awareness drives such as the VIKSIT BHARAT SANKALP YATRA to educate communities about the importance of safe drinking water and sanitation.
9. Collaboration with Local Institutions: Engaging with local entities like schools, Anganwadi centers, health facilities, and Gram Panchayats to promote water safety and quality.
10. Continuous Monitoring: Implementing a systematic approach to monitor water quality and engage with community members to ensure adherence to safety standards.

Through these efforts, Deep Welfare Organization is playing a crucial role in achieving the goals of the Jal Jeevan Mission and improving the quality of life in rural communities. Your focus on community engagement and education is particularly important for the sustainability of safe drinking water initiatives.



RURAL DEVELOPMENT & AGRICULTURE

The interconnection between development, livelihood, and agriculture is crucial, especially in a country like India, where about 65% of the population lives in rural areas. Emphasizing profitable farming practices and ancillary services is essential for ensuring sustainable development. The organization recognizes the pivotal role of agriculture in promoting social and political stability in India.

To enhance agricultural practices, Deep Welfare Organization promotes organic farming, emphasizing the advantages of avoiding synthetic inputs and adopting crop rotation and pasture management. This sustainable approach not only mitigates environmental harm but also creates employment opportunities due to the increased manual labor involved in organic farming.

The organization actively supports farmers by providing them with quality seeds and conducting awareness programs like Krishi Samadhan and Kisan Sabha. Collaborating with local Panchayats, these initiatives aim to educate farmers about organic farming techniques and practices. In districts across Bihar and Jharkhand, their specialized experts engage directly with farmers, ensuring they are well-informed about sustainable practices that can improve both environmental health and agricultural productivity.

Through these efforts, the Deep Welfare Organization seeks to create a more sustainable and economically viable agricultural framework, ultimately enhancing the livelihoods of rural communities while promoting holistic development in India.

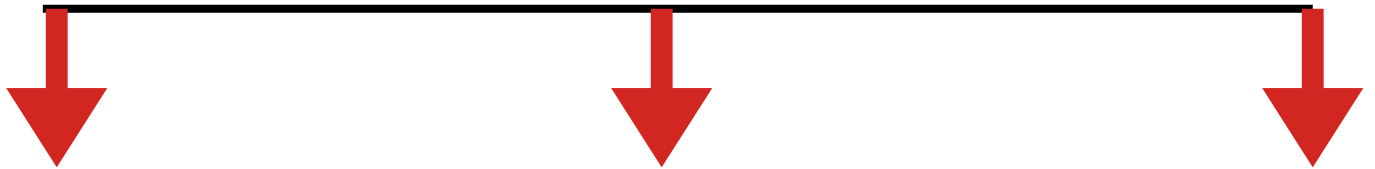


ORGANISATIONAL CHART
